
The study circle meets regularly by Zoom and there are over 20 designated Group Leaders of Pacific territories who can offer expert advice to member's inquiries.



The Study Circle is run by collectors for collectors. PISC has over 240 members, almost half in the UK and over half in the rest of Europe, North America, Africa, Asia and the Pacific.

The annual subscription includes 4 printed issues of *Pacifica*. The rate is £16 for UK and other European residents and £20 for those living elsewhere. These rates also entitle members to download the digital version of *Pacifica* from our website. Members joining during the year will be sent the relevant back issues of *Pacifica*.

For those who only require the digital version of *Pacifica* the annual subscription is just £7.50.
